GUYANA

ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE

(Chapter 309)

UNDER SECTION 42 OF THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING ME IN THAT BEHALF, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER —

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs (Amendment) Order, 1969, and shall come into operation forthwith.

2. The second schedule to the Customs Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition to the List of Restricted Imports of the following paragraph —

“9. Cinematograph films (within the meaning of section 2 of the Cinematograph Ordinance) to the exhibition of which the exemption provided in paragraph (a) or (c) of subsection (1) of section 15 of the said Ordinance applies, unless —

- (i) at the time of the importation of any such film into Guyana, the importer thereof deposits it with an officer who shall issue a receipt therefor;
- (ii) the importer furnishes the Minister for the time being assigned responsibility for the maintenance of public safety and public order (hereinafter referred to as “the Minister”) with a true statement of the general nature of the subject-matter of any such film;
- (iii) the Minister on satisfying himself by such means as he may think fit (including the taking of custody of the film for the purpose of viewing it) that the film is in no manner prejudicial to public safety, public order, public morality, public health or the defence of Guyana, issues to the importer a certificate to that effect; and
- (iv) the importer presents the certificate and the receipt to the officer and pays such duty as may be payable on the film.”
