## ORDER

## MADE UNDER

THE MINISTERS, MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY AND  
SPECIAL OFFICES (EMOLUMENTS) ORDINANCE, 1965  
(No. 7 of 1965)

UNDER SECTION 8 OF THE MINISTERS, MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY AND SPECIAL OFFICES (EMOLUMENTS) ORDINANCE, 1965, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING ME IN THAT BEHALF, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Ministers, Members of the National Assembly and Special Offices (Allowances) (No. 2) Order, 1969, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st January, 1969.

2. The schedule to the Ministers, Members of the House of Assembly and Special Offices (Emoluments) Ordinance, 1965 is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following paragraphs :—

"11. The persons holding the respective offices specified hereunder shall be paid duty allowances at the rates specified hereunder in respect of the said offices —

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Prime Minister .....	7,200 per annum
Deputy Prime Minister .....	6,000 per annum
Every other Minister (except the Attorney-General) .....	4,800 per annum
Leader of the Opposition .....	3,600 per annum
Parliamentary Secretary .....	1,800 per annum
Government Whip .....	1,800 per annum
Opposition Whip .....	1,800 per annum
Every other Member of the National Assembly (except the Attorney-General). ....	1,200 per annum.

12. There shall be paid to every Minister an allowance to be paid by him as a gratuity to his chauffeur calculated at the rate of twenty-two and one-half per centum of the basic salary paid to the chauffeur for each completed month of employment, payable either at intervals of six months or at the termination of the employment of the chauffeur:

Provided that no such allowance shall be paid unless the Minister certifies that the chauffeur has discharged his duties satisfactorily.”

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### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order makes provision for the payment of duty allowances to Ministers (other than the Attorney-General), the Leader of the Opposition and other Members of the National Assembly. The Order also makes provision for the payment of allowances to Ministers representing gratuities to be paid by them to their chauffeurs.
