THE TRADE ORDINANCE

(No. 34 of 1958).

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS VESTED IN THE PRESIDENT BY SECTION 5 OF THE TRADE ORDINANCE 1958, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trade (Control of Import and Export) (No. 3) Order, 1970.

2. The Trade (Control of Import and Export) Order, 1963* is hereby amended by the insertion, in the first schedule thereto, in the appropriate sequence, of the following items —

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Under the provisions of this Order, batteries and ice cream cones may only be imported into Guyana by virtue of a licence granted by the Competent Authority. However, by virtue of the Caribbean Free Trade Association Order (No. 23 of 1968), no import licence is required when batteries and ice cream cones are imported from Member Territories.
