

ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE IMPORT, EXPORT AND CUSTOMS POWERS (DEFENCE)
ORDINANCE, 1939, (No. 34 of 1939).

UNDER SECTION 3 (1) OF THE IMPORT, EXPORT AND CUSTOMS POWERS (DEFENCE) ORDINANCE, 1939, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Exportation (Gift Parcels) Order, 1947.

2. The exportation without licence from the Colony of postal packets which contain *bona fide* unsolicited gifts is hereby authorised subject to the following conditions—

- (a) all such postal packets must be addressed to individuals, and must be transmitted by parcel post;

Provided that where the postal packet does not exceed two pounds in gross weight and does not contain any foodstuff, it shall be lawful to transmit it by small packet post;

- (b) every such postal packet or small packet must be clearly marked in a conspicuous place on the outer cover with the word "Gift";
- (c) a packet shall not exceed twenty-two pounds in gross weight or twenty-four dollars in value;
- (d) a packet addressed to the United Kingdom or to a member of His Majesty's Forces may contain imported articles (foodstuffs, clothing, toilet soap, etc.) not exceeding fifteen dollars in value;

Provided that imported foodstuffs in such a packet shall not exceed seven pounds in weight, nor shall there be more than two pounds of any one kind of such foodstuffs in a packet;

- (e) a packet which is not addressed to the United Kingdom or to a member of His Majesty's Forces shall not contain imported articles;
- (f) no packet shall contain—
- (i) laundry soap,
 - (ii) more than two cakes of toilet soap,
 - (iii) more than two pounds of rice;

(g) not more than one packet containing imported articles shall be sent in any one month by the same sender to the same addressee.

3. Postal gift packets sent in contravention of this Order are liable to forfeiture.

4. The Exportation (United Kingdom Gift Parcels) Order, 1945,* is hereby revoked.
