THE GEORGETOWN TOWN COUNCIL (SPECIAL POWERS) (WATER SUPPLY) ORDINANCE, 1954,
(No. 7 of 1954).

UNDER SECTION 2 (2) OF THE GEORGETOWN TOWN COUNCIL (SPECIAL POWERS) (WATER SUPPLY) ORDINANCE, 1954, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Georgetown Town Council (Special Powers) (Water Supply) (Extension of Areas) Order, 1964.
2. The area described in the schedule to this Order is hereby substituted for the areas described in the schedule to the Georgetown Town Council (Special Powers) (Water Supply) Ordinance, 1954.

SCHEDULE

The area of land known as the Greater Georgetown Area bounded on the north by the Atlantic Ocean, on the south by the southern boundary of Plantation Rome, on the east by the eastern boundary of the company path on the east side of Plantations Cummings Lodge, Houston and Rome, and on the west by the Demerara River, as shown bordered in green on a Plan of Georgetown and its environs on record in the office of the Central Housing and Planning Authority, situate at 169, New Market and Waterloo Streets, Georgetown.
