

**ORDER IN COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 34 OF THE POST  
AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 185, FIX-  
ING THE RATES OF COMMISSION TO BE PAID ON  
CERTAIN POSTAL ORDERS.**

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 34 (1) of the Post and Telegraph Ordinance, Chapter 185, that the Postmaster-General, subject to the approval of the Governor, may provide for the remission of small sums of money through the Post Office by means of money orders, and may demand and receive, in respect of those money orders, rates of commission for the time being fixed by an Order in Council ;

And whereas the Postmaster-General, with the approval of the Governor, has provided for the remission within the Colony of the undermentioned small sums of money through the Post Office by means of money orders (which expression includes postal orders) of the denominations set out below :

Now, therefore, the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council doth hereby fix the following rates of commission as the rates to be demanded and received by the Postmaster-General in respect of the following money orders as from the 1st of June, 1934, or as soon after that date as possible :—

<i>Amount of Order.</i>	...	<i>Commission.</i>
Thirty-six cents	...	2 cents.
Sixty cents	...	3 "
Seventy-two cents	...	3 "
Ninety-six cents	...	3 "
One dollar and Twenty cents	...	3 "
