THE IMMIGRATION ACT

(Cap. 14:02)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON ME BY SECTION 5 OF THE IMMIGRATION ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

1. This Order, which amends the Immigration (Passports) Order 1984, may be cited as the Immigration (Passport) (Amendment) Order 1989. Citation,
No. 18 of
19 84.

2. Clause 3 of the Principal Order is hereby amended in the following respects — Amendment
of Clause 3
of the prin-
cipal Order.

- (a) in paragraph (1), by the substitution for the word "Paragraph", of the word "Clause";
- (b) by the insertion, after paragraph (1), of the following paragraphs as paragraphs (1A) and (1B) —

“(1A) clause 2 shall not apply to —

- (a) diplomatic or service passports issued by the Government of Venezuela to a subject or citizen of Venezuela who is a member of the Embassy, or a member of the consular post, of Venezuela in Guyana;
- (b) diplomatic or service passports issued by the Government of Venezuela to a subject or citizen of Venezuela, not being a member of the Embassy or of the consular post of Venezuela in Guyana, who is travelling through Guyana for official purposes on behalf of the Government of Venezuela

Provided that such subject or citizen seeking to enter Guyana proposes to remain therein only for a period not exceeding one month from the date of his entry into Guyana and after entering Guyana remains therein only for a period not exceeding the aforesaid period of one month or such further period as the Government of Guyana may allow at the request of the Embassy of Venezuela in Guyana.

(1B) In paragraph (1), the expression member of the consular post has the same meaning as in the Privileges and Immunities (Diplomatic, Consular and International Organisation) Act.”:

(c) in paragraph (2), by the substitution for the word “paragraph” of the word “clause”.
