IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON ME BY SECTION
4 OF THE MINISTERS, MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL
ASSEMBLY AND SPECIAL OFFICES (EMOLUMENTS) ACT, I
HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

1. This Order, which amends the Ministers, Members of
the National Assembly and Special Offices (Allowances) Order,^{Citation.}
may be cited as the Ministers, Members of the National Assembly
and Special Offices (Allowances) (Amendment) Order 1986.

2. The schedule to the Principal Order is hereby amended<sup>Amendment
of Schedule
to the Princi-
pal Order.</sup>
as follows —

- a) by the insertion in paragraph 1 after sub-paragraph
(3) of the following sub-paragraph as sub-paragraph
(4) —

“(4) (a) Notwithstanding anything contained in
sub-paragraph (3), the allowance specified
to be paid thereunder to the holders of
the offices mentioned therein for the pur-
pose of meeting the expenses incurred in
respect of the employment of a chauffeur
shall with effect from 1st January, 1985
as mentioned in the Table below

I

Chauffeur allowance for 1985

PART A

Where a chauffeur in employment on 1984 — 12 — 31 is continued in employment as such thereafter in 1985.

Allowance on 31 — 12 — 1984	Allowance in 1985 <i>+ 5% basic</i>
1. \$720	\$763.20
2. \$745	\$790.70
3. \$771	\$819.30
4. \$810	\$862.20

PART B

Where a new chauffeur is employed in 1985

\$745.92 plus an increase in the basic salary by such fraction of 4% as is obtained by dividing the number of days the chauffeur worked in 1985 by 365

TABLE II

Chauffeur allowance for 1986

(1) Where a chauffeur in employment on 1985 — 12 — 31 is continued in employment as such thereafter or a new chauffeur is employed in 1986.

The allowance as mentioned in the appropriate entry in the second column of Part A of Table I plus an increase by 5% of such sum as represents the basic salary in the aforesaid allowance.

(2) In addition to the allowance mentioned in item (1) with effect from 1986 — 01 — 01 such further sum, as may be awarded by the Minister responsible for finance in the last quarter of 1986 based on the actual appraisal of the work of the chauffeur.

Noted: In Tables I and II basic salary means-

(1) where the allowance payable on 1984-12-31 is \$720	\$432
(2) where the allowance payable on 1984-12-31 is \$745	\$457
(3) where the allowance payable on 1984-12-31 is \$771	\$483
(4) where the allowance payable on 1984-12-31 is \$810	\$522

(b) by the substitution in paragraph 4 for the words-
"\$225" of the words "\$700"; and

(c) by the insertion after paragraph 4 of the following
paragraph as paragraph 4A

"4A. Every member of the National Assembly (other than the Prime Minister,
the Attorney General, a Minister, a Parliamentary Secretary, the Speaker of the
National Assembly or the Minority Leader) shall be paid a commuted travelling
allowance of \$700 per month."
