

ORDER
MADE UNDER
THE RICE (CESS) ORDINANCE, 1952,
(No. 6 of 1952).

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Rice (Cess) Order 1952, the British Guiana Rice Marketing Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") was authorised and directed to pay to the Financial Secretary and Treasurer a cess on all rice sold by the Board for consumption within the Colony at the rate of ninety cents per bag of one hundred and eighty pounds gross weight with effect from the 22nd day of February, 1952;

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the operation of the aforesaid Order shall be suspended for the year nineteen hundred and fifty-three in order that the sum which would have been so payable under the aforesaid Order during this year should be retained by the Board for the improvement of its financial position.

NOW THEREFORE, I do hereby order, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Rice (Cess) Order, 1953.
2. Anything in the provisions of the Rice (Cess) Order, 1952*, to the contrary notwithstanding, the Board shall not be required to pay to the Financial Secretary and Treasurer a cess on rice sold during the year nineteen hundred and fifty-three by the Board for consumption within the Colony.
