

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

MADE UNDER

THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936,  
(No. 29 of 1936).

UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936,  
IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL AS  
FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Animal Diseases (Prohibition of Importation) Order, 1953.

2. In this Order —

“swine” means pigs;

“fodder” means fodder of any kind brought with such swine;

“litter” means any straw, hay and any other substance used as bedding for any swine and includes excreta of such swine.

3. On and after the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, swine, carcasses of swine, hams, bacon, lard, hoofs, bristles, hides and other work by-products, fodder, litter, livestock containers or parts thereof, crates, cages or receptacles which may have contained any of the abovementioned parts or by-products shall not be brought from Trinidad, British West Indies, into the Colony.
