

ORDER IN COUNCIL
MADE UNDER
THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936,
(No. 29 of 1936).

UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936,
IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL AS
FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Animal Diseases (Restriction of Importation) Order, 1953.

2. In this Order—

“fodder” means fodder of any kind brought with swine;

“litter” means any straw, hay or other substance used as bedding for any swine and includes excreta of such swine.

3. On and after the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, swine, carcasses of swine, ham, bacon, lard, hoofs, bristles, hides and other by-products of swine, fodder and litter of swine, containers, crates, cages and receptacles used to convey swine or any part or by-product of swine shall not be brought from the United States of America into the Colony except such swine, parts or by-products thereof are, in addition to the normal meat inspection certificates, accompanied by—

(a) a certificate from the Federal or State Veterinarian in the area where the swine originated stating that—

(i) such swine came from and were slaughtered in a State which was free from vesicular exanthema for a period of at least two months immediately prior to slaughter and which has remained free of that disease to date;

(ii) such swine were not fed raw garbage during the period of thirty days immediately prior to slaughter;

(iii) such swine were inspected immediately before shipment to the processing plant and found to be free from any sign of vesicular exanthema and were transported directly to the processing plant in clean vehicles; and

(b) a certificate from the Federal or State Veterinarian in charge of the slaughter or processing plant at which such swine were slaughtered or processed to the effect that—

(i) such parts or by-products were derived from swine slaughtered after the first day of July, 1953;

(ii) such parts or by-products were derived from swine which were not mixed with, or placed in yards or runs in which had been placed, swine, other than swine certificated under sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph.
