

## BRITISH GUIANA

ORDER IN COUNCIL  
MADE UNDER  
THE ANIMALS DISEASES ORDINANCE,  
(Chapter 258).

UNDER SECTION 15 OF THE ANIMALS DISEASES ORDINANCE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Animals Diseases (Anthrax) Order, 1956.

2. In this Order—

“animal” shall include all feathered stock;

“approved disinfectant” means a disinfectant approved by the Director.

3. Owing to the presence therein of suspected cases of anthrax the areas described in the schedule hereto are hereby declared to be, for the purposes of the abovementioned Ordinance, areas infected with anthrax.

4. No person shall leave any of the areas described in the schedule hereto unless he has first immersed his hands and feet in an approved disinfectant to the satisfaction of an officer or a veterinary surgeon.

SCHEDULE

1. Lot number 50 Main Street, in the city of Georgetown.
2. Lot number 121, Third Street, Alberttown, in the city of Georgetown.
3. Lot “C” part of Plantation Thomas, in the city of Georgetown.
4. All that area of Crown Land known as D’Urban Park situate east of Stabroek Ward, and bounded as follows—  
On the North by the trench south of the Botanical Gardens;  
On the South by the trench north of the road between the D’Urban Park and Lodge Village;  
On the East by the Crown Lands occupied by the Agriculture Department, about 2,700 feet east of Vlissengen Road;  
On the West by the road parapet on the eastern side of Vlissengen Road.
