## ORDER IN COUNCIL

MADE UNDER

THE LABOUR ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 103).

UNDER SECTION 8 OF THE LABOUR ORDINANCE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Minimum Wages (Dry Goods Store Employees) Order, 1956.

2. In this Order —

“cash boy” means a person employed wholly or mainly for the purpose of collecting cash from customers paying bills;

“clerk” includes a salesman, counter assistant, customs clerk, cashier, and a person employed to assist in correspondence and book-keeping;

“country district” means an area other than Georgetown or New Amsterdam;

“dry goods store” means any place or premises used solely or mainly for the sale of dry goods either by way of wholesale or retail trade;

“Georgetown” means the city of Georgetown as defined in section 4 of the Georgetown Town Council Ordinance, and the area within one mile of the boundaries thereof;

“messenger” means a person employed to receive and deliver messages and undertake portering duties, and shall include a delivery boy;

“New Amsterdam” means the town of New Amsterdam as defined in section 6 of the New Amsterdam Town Council Ordinance;

“porter” means a person who is wholly or mainly employed for portering duties, and for the purpose of this Order:

“portering duties” includes the following:—

carrying goods or supplies, taking messages, and cleaning premises, furniture, or fittings (including the cleaning of windows).

3. (1) The minimum rate of wages payable to a person employed in a dry goods store in Georgetown or New Amsterdam in any of the categories of work set out in the first column of the schedule to this Order shall be the appropriate rate set out in the second column of that schedule.

(2) The minimum rate of wages payable to a person employed in a dry goods store in a country district in any of the categories of work set out in the first column of the schedule to this Order shall be the appropriate rate set out in the third column of that schedule.

4. The Minimum Wages (Dry Goods Store Employees) Order, 1953, is hereby revoked.

5. This Order shall come into force on the first day of September, 1956.

Unskilled Female Workers not employed in any of the above-mentioned categories of work.	\$ 1.80 per day ..	\$ 1.44 per day

The minimum rate of wages payable to a person employed during any period of time mentioned in this schedule in more than one category of work set out above, in respect of which different minimum rates of wages are set out, shall be the highest of such rates.

The minimum rate of wages payable to a person employed in any of the above categories of work for any shorter period of time than the appropriate period set out above shall be the appropriate minimum rate of wages set out above in respect of the last mentioned period.
