ORDER IN COUNCIL

Made Under

'THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT' ORDINANCE

(Chapter 150)

UNDER SECTION 30 OF 'THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT' ORDINANCE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Hopetown-Bel Air Village District (Elections) Order, 1957.

2. For the purpose of the election of councillors, the Hopetown Bel Air Village District, on the West Coast of Berbice, is hereby divided into three divisions, namely, the Firebrace Division, the Saint John Division and the Bel Air Division, the boundaries of which are described in the schedule hereto.

3. The number of councillors appointed to be elected by each division shall be as follows:—

- (a) by the Firebrace Division, three councillors;
- (b) by the Saint John Division, one councillor; and
- (c) by the Bel Air Division, two councillors.

SCHEDULE

1. (Boundaries of the Firebrace Division).

On the North —By the southern edge of the Saint John Drainage trench between Firebrace and Saint John and its prolongation westwards to the reef known as 'High Spot' which is about 2400 feet west of the back boundary of the tract of 189.022 acres held by William E. Alfred and others under Lease A 5677.

On the South —By the common boundary on the sideline dam between Hopetown and Onderneeming and its prolongation westwards to the reef known as 'High Spot' which is about 2400 feet west of the back boundary of the tract of 189.022 acres held by William E. Alfred and others under Lease A 5677.

On the East —By the Atlantic Ocean.

On the West —By the reef known as 'High Spot' which is about 2400 feet west of the back boundary of the tract of 189.022 acres held by William E. Alfred and others under Lease A 5677.

2. (Boundaries of the Saint John Division).

On the North —By the southern edge of the Bel Air main drainage trench and its prolongation westwards to the reef known as 'High Spot' which is about 2400 feet west of the back boundary of the tract of 189.022 acres held by William E. Alfred and others under Lease A 5677.

On the South —By the southern edge of the Saint John drainage trench between Firebrace and Saint John and its prolongation westwards to the reef known as 'High Spot' which is about 2400 feet west of the back boundary of the tract of 189.022 acres held by William E. Alfred and others under Lease A 5677.

On the East —By the Atlantic Ocean.

On the West —By the reef known as 'High Spot' which is about 2400 feet west of the back boundary of the tract of 189.022 acres held by William E. Alfred and others under Lease A 5677.

3. (Boundaries of the Bel Air Division).

On the North —By the common boundary on the sideline dam between Bel Air and Armadale and its prolongation westwards to the reef known as 'High Spot' which is about 2400 feet west of the back boundary of the tract of 189.022 acres held by William E. Alfred and others under Lease A 5677.

On the South —By the southern edge of the Bel Air main drainage trench and its prolongation westwards to the reef known as 'High Spot' which is about 2400 feet west of the back boundary of the tract of 189.022 acres held by William E. Alfred and others under Lease A 5677.

On the East —By the Atlantic Ocean.

On the West —By the reef known as 'High Spot' which is about 2400 feet west of the back boundary of the tract of 189.022 acres held by William E. Alfred and others under Lease A 5677.
