ORDER IN COUNCIL

MADE UNDER

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE, (Chapter 150)

UNDER SECTION 30 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Lots Nos. 57/66 Village District (Elections) Order, 1960.
- 2. For the purpose of the election of councillors, the Lots Nos. 57/66 Village District on the east coast of the County of Berbice, is hereby divided into two divisions, namely the Lots Nos. 57/60 Division and the Lots Nos. 61/66 Division, the boundaries of which are described in the schedule hereto.
- 3. The number of councillors appointed to be elected by each division shall be as follows:—
 - (a) by the Lots Nos. 57/60 Division, five councillors;
 - (b) by the Lots Nos. 61/66 Division, seven councillors.

SCHEDULE

- 1. (Boundaries of the Lots Nos. 57/60 Division).
 - On the north by the common boundary between Lots Nos. 56 and 57 in the first depth, and by the common boundary between the Crown Lands in the rear of Lots Nos. 56 and 57 in the second depth; On the south by the common boundary between Lots Nos. 60 and 61 in the first depth and the common boundary between the Crown Lands

in the rear of Lots Nos. 60 and 61 in the second depth;

On the east by the Atlantic Ocean;

On the west by a line parallel to and fifty feet west of the centre line of the back empolder dam, known as the Seaford Dam, near the extremity of the second depths of Lots Nos. 57, 58, 59 and 60.

- 2. (Boundaries of the Lots Nos. 61/66 Division).
- On the north by the common boundary between Lots Nos. 60 and 61 in the first depth, and by the common boundary between the Crown Lands in the rear of Lots Nos. 60 and 61 in the second depth;

On the south by the common boundary between Lots Nos. 66 and 67 in the first depth, and by the common boundary between the Crown Lands

in the rear of Lots Nos. 66 and 67 in the second depth;

On the east by the Atlantic Ocean;

On the west by a line parallel to and fifty feet west of the centre line of the back empolder dam, known as the Seaford Dam, near the extremity of the second depth of Lots Nos. 61, 62, 63, 64, 65 and 66.
