ORDER IN COUNCIL

MADE UNDER

THE SUMMARY JURISDICTION (PROCEDURE) ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 15).

UNDER SECTION 7A(2) OF THE SUMMARY JURISDICTION (PROCEDURE) ORDINANCE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS :—

1.(1) This Order may be cited as the Minor Offences (Penalties) Order, 1960.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the 15th February, 1960.

2. The penalties which offenders shall pay in lieu of being prosecuted for the offences set out in the first column of the schedule hereto shall be those set out in the second column of the said schedule.

(3) Offences against section 153 of the Summary Jurisdiction (Offences) Ordinance, Chapter 14.	\$2.50
(4) Offences against sections 40 and 55 of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Ordinance, Chapter 280.	\$2.50
(5) Offences against regulations 3 to 8 inclusive, 33(b), 34(a), 56, 164 to 167 inclusive and 179 to 187 inclusive, of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Regulations.	\$2.50
(6) Offences against the General Traffic Directions made by the Commissioner of Police on the 24th November, 1937, under the Summary Jurisdiction (Offences) Ordinance and continued in force by section 117 of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Ordinance.	\$2.50
(7) Offences against any order, other than the Road Traffic (Georgetown) Order, made by the Licensing Authority under section 47, 50 or 102 of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Ordinance, Chapter 280.	\$2.50
(8) Offences against sections 24, 26, 35, 51 and 56 of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Ordinance, Chapter 280.	\$5.00
(9) Offences against the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Regulations other than those specified in items (1) and (5).	\$5.00
(10) Offences against the Road Traffic (Georgetown) Order.	\$5.00
