

BRITISH GUIANA

ORDER IN COUNCIL
MADE UNDER
THE SEA DEFENCE ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 191)

WHEREAS it is provided by section 11 of the Sea Defence Ordinance, that when a sudden calamity occurs whereby any land in a district is likely to be or is inundated by the sea the Governor in Council may order the Board to take such immediate action and perform such works as may in the opinion of the Board be necessary to avert or mitigate such inundation:

AND WHEREAS, a sudden calamity has occurred whereby land in the area between Foulis and Paradise, West Coast Berbice, is likely to be inundated by the sea:

NOW THEREFORE, the Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order the Board to take such immediate action and perform such works as may in the opinion of the Board be necessary to avert or mitigate such inundation.

This Order may be cited as the Sea Defence (Emergency) Order, 1960.
