THE NATIONAL SECURITY (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT

(Cap. 16:02)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON THE MINISTER
BY SECTION 29 OF THE NATIONAL SECURITY (MISCELLANEOUS
PROVISIONS) ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

1. This Order may be cited as the National Security (Miscellaneous Provision) (Amnesty) Order 1985.

2.(1) Any person who surrenders any firearm, ammunition or explosive at a police station to the officer in charge of the police station or elsewhere to any policeman during the period commencing on 1st October, 1985 and ending on 31st October, 1985 shall not be prosecuted under the Firearm Act or section 23 of the Act for illegally purchasing, acquiring or possessing such firearm, ammunition or explosive prior to the time of such surrender or at that time.

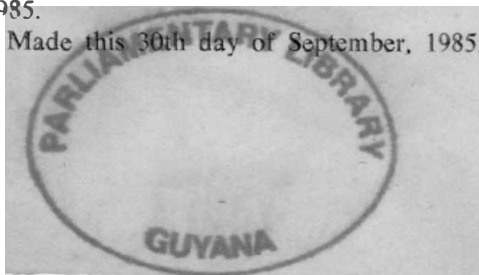
(2) Any person who surrenders any firearm, ammunition or explosive under paragraph (1) shall be issued with a receipt therefor by the officer in charge of the police station where it was surrendered or by the policeman to whom it was surrendered.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order grants amnesty to persons in illegal possession of any firearm, ammunition or explosive if they surrender it to a policeman during the period specified for that purpose, that is from 1st October 1985 to 31st October 1985.
