ORDER

THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 280).

UNDER SECTION 47 OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE HAS MADE THE FOLLOWING ORDER WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR ACTING IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH 1 OF ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Road Traffic (Campbellville) (One-Way Streets) Order, 1962.
2. No vehicle shall proceed in an easterly direction in or along Akawinni Street from its junction with Sheriff Street to its junction with Bel Air Avenue.
3. No vehicle shall proceed in a westerly direction in or along Bonasika Street from its junction with Bel Air Avenue to its junction with Sheriff Street.
4. No vehicle shall proceed in an easterly direction in or along Canje Street from its junction with Sheriff Street to its junction with Bel Air Avenue.
5. No vehicle shall proceed in a westerly direction in or along Dadanawa Street from its junction with Bel Air Avenue to its junction with Sheriff Street.
6. No vehicle shall proceed in a southerly direction in or along Bel Air Avenue for the entire length thereof.
7. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of March, 1962.
