IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON THE MINISTER BY SECTION 5 OF THE TRADE ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

- This Order may be cited as the Trade (Regulation of Sale of Citation. Petrol) Order 1979.
 - 2. In this Order —

Interpretation.

"filling station" means any petrol pump or filling station in respect of which a licence is required to be taken out under section 61 of the Tax Act;

"filling station owner" means any person who is required to take out a licence in respect of a filling station under section 61 of the Tax Act; and

Cap. 80:01

- "petrol" means gasolene, diesel fuel or kerosene.
- 3. Except where permission has been granted under clause 4, Restriction no person shall sell or otherwise dispose of or buy or otherwise acquire of sale of petrol on any petrol at any filling station on any Saturday or Sunday.
- 4. (1) Where, after taking into account the supplies of petrol Permission available in Guyana, the Minister considers it necessary or convenient to sell. for the service of the public to do so, he may give permission to any

filling station owner to sell petrol at his filling station on any Saturday or Sunday.

- (2) Any permission granted under this clause
 - (a) may be either general or limited to a specified filling station;
 - (b) may be absolute or conditional;
 - (c) may be limited so as to expire on a specified date unless renewed:
 - (d) may be revoked by the Minister; and
 - (e) shall be published by the Minister in such a way as, in his opinion, to give adequate notice of it to the public, unless in his opinion publication is not necessary.
