THE TRADE ACT

(Cap. 91:01)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON THE MINISTER BY SECTION 5 OF THE TRADE ACT. I HEREBY ORDER AS FOLLOWS:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Trade (Control of Citation Prices) (Cycles and Parts of Cycles) Order 1979 and shall be read and construed as one with the Trade (Control of Prices) Order No. 33.
- 2. In this Order "landed cost" means the sum of the Interprevalue of an article referred to in clause 3 as determined under the Customs Act, and the customs import duty, the consumption c. 82:01 tax and the External Trade Bureau commission charged thereon.
- 3. (1) The maximum prices at which cycles (including Maximum delivery tricycles) and parts thereof, bearing tariff heading and retail numbers 87.10 and 87.12 respectively and described in the prices second column of Part A of the First Schedule, shall be sold by schedule. Wholesale shall be determined by the method set out in the third fourth and fifth columns of the said Part.
- (2) The maximum prices at which cycles (including delivery tricycles) and parts thereof, bearing tariff heading numbers 87.10 and 87.12 respectively and described in the second column of Part B of the First Schedule, shall be sold by retail shall be determined by the method set out in the third, fourth and fifth columns of the said Part.

Duty to give bill, Second Schedule.

- 4. (1) Where a person sells by wholesale or retail an article referred to in clause 3, he shall, when delivering the article to or for the purchaser, give to the recipient a bill in respect of the article containing the particulars required in the Second Schedule and retain in his possession a duplicate thereof. Each bill and duplicate thereof shall be signed by the person delivering the article and by the person receiving it.
- (2) It shall be the duty of any person receiving an article referred in clause 3 from a seller to furnish him with all information reasonably required to enable the bill relating to the article to be properly completed.
