THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 1963.

(No. 7 of 1963)

WHEREAS I am satisfied that the holding of public processions other than funeral processions or processions of Her Majesty's forces or of the British Guiana Volunteer Force or of the Police Force on any highway, public park or garden, sea beach, and on any public bridge, landing-place, road, street, land, footway, square, court, alley or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not, or in any open space to which, for the time being, the public have or are permitted to have access, or on or along or within the immediate vicinity of any public road, within the part of the Colony specified in the schedule hereto would be likely to cause a disturbance of public order or to promote disaffection:

NOW THEREFORE by virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 20 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 1963, in accordance with article 22 of the Constitution of British Guiana, and by virtue and in exercise of all powers enabling me in that behalf I do hereby prohibit the holding of any such procession unless the Commissioner of Police shall have given his permission in writing to the holding thereof.

SCHEDULE

All that portion of the Colony, including Kitty and Alexanderville, Subryanville, Campbellville, Newtown, Bel Air, Lodge Village, La Penitence, the Laing Avenue Flats and the City of Georgetown and more particularly described as follows:-

Bounded on the North: by the Λ tlantic Ocean from the mouth of the Demerara River to the boundary between

Plantations Bel Air and Sophia.

Bounded on the East: by the boundary between Plantations Bel Air and Sophia extending from the Atlantic Ocean to the Lamaha Canal, thence by the Lamaha Canal to the trench on the southern side of the Company Path between Planta-

Bounded on the South:

by the trench on the southern side of the Company Path between Plantations La Penitence and Ruimveldt extending from the Lamaha Canal to the Demerara River.

Bounded on the West:

by the Demerara River extending from the trench on the southern side of the Company Path between Plantations La Penitence and Ruimveldt to the Atlantic Ocean.
