

BRITISH GUIANA

ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 1963,
(No. 7 of 1963).

WHEREAS it is necessary in the interest of public safety and order that certain motor trucks mentioned hereunder situated in British Guiana be requisitioned:

NOW THEREFORE acting in accordance with article 22 of the Constitution of British Guiana and under regulation 36 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 1963, and by virtue and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, it is hereby ordered by the Governor as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Requisition of Motor Trucks) Order, 1963.

2.(1) In this Order "Competent Authority" means the Commander, British Forces in British Guiana, and includes any person authorised in writing by him to perform any of his functions under this Order. Any person so authorised shall act subject to such directions as may from time to time be given by the Competent Authority.

(2) The Deputy Assistant Quarter Master General, British Forces in British Guiana, shall be deemed to have been authorised for the purposes of the preceding paragraph to perform all the functions of the Competent Authority under this Order.

3.(1) Each of the motor trucks specified in the first column of the schedule hereto is hereby requisitioned with effect from the date, stated opposite that truck, in the second column of the schedule hereto.

(2) The provisions of this article shall have effect subject to the provisions for payment of compensation contained in regulation 37 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 1963.

4.(1) Any person who has the ownership, possession, custody, control or management of any motor truck requisitioned under the provisions of this Order (hereinafter referred to as "the proprietor") shall on demand by the Competent Authority forthwith deliver to him that motor truck.

(2) Where the proprietor from any cause whatsoever does not comply with a demand made under the preceding paragraph, the proprietor shall on demand by the Competent Authority forthwith deliver to him or provide him with any keys or any other means whatsoever of obtaining access to any premises in which is to be found any motor truck requisitioned under this order and for removing any such motor truck.

(3) Where the proprietor from any cause whatsoever does not comply with a demand made under the immediately preceding paragraph the Competent Authority may do all such acts and things as may be reasonably necessary for him to take any motor truck requisitioned under this Order.

5.(1) Where it appears to the Competent Authority that any motor truck requisitioned under this Order is no longer needed he may cause that motor truck to be delivered to any person from whom that motor truck was requisitioned or if that person refuses or neglects to accept delivery, cause that motor truck to be placed on or as near as may be reasonably practicable on any of that person's premises, and thereupon the requisitioning of that motor truck shall come to an end.

(2) For the purposes of this article delivery of any motor truck to the servant or agent of any person shall be deemed to be a delivery to that person.

6. In addition to the other powers conferred upon him by any other provision of this Order the Competent Authority is hereby authorised to perform all such functions as may be necessary or expedient in connection with the requisitioning.
