

BRITISH GUIANA

ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 280).

WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of section 99 of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Ordinance, Chapter 280, the Governor may by order for the purpose of giving effect to any convention for facilitating the international circulation of motor vehicles provide for modifying the provisions of the said Ordinance and regulations made thereunder relating to the registration of motor vehicles, the licensing of motor vehicles and the licensing of motor vehicle drivers in case of motor vehicles brought temporarily into the Colony by persons resident abroad and intending to make only a temporary stay in the Colony, and of drivers entering the Colony for the purpose of driving any such vehicles:

NOW THEREFORE, under the provisions of section 99 (1) (b) of the aforesaid Ordinance, in accordance with paragraph (1) of article 22 of the Constitution of British Guiana, and by virtue and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, it is hereby ordered by the Governor as follows:—

Vehicles registered in the territory of any of the Contracting Parties to the Convention on the Taxation of Road Vehicles for Private Use in International Traffic done at Geneva on the 18th May, 1956, brought temporarily into British Guiana by persons resident abroad, and intending to make only a temporary stay in the Colony, and drivers entering British Guiana for the purpose of driving any such vehicles, shall be exempted from the provisions of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Ordinance aforesaid and any regulations made thereunder in so far as they relate to the registration of motor vehicles, the licensing of motor vehicles and the licensing of motor vehicle drivers.
