

BRITISH GUIANA

ORDER
MADE UNDER
THE TRADE ORDINANCE, 1958,
(No. 34 of 1958).

UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE TRADE ORDINANCE, 1958, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR'S DEPUTY AS FOLLOWS:—

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Trade (Control of Import and Export) (No. 2) Order, 1963.

(2) The Trade (Control of Import and Export) Order, 1963, and the Trade (Control of Import and Export) (Amendment) Order, 1963, are hereby revoked.

2. Subject to the provisions of articles 4 and 5 of this Order, no goods specified in the first schedule hereto shall be imported from any country after the coming into force of this Order except under the authority of a licence (hereinafter referred to as an import licence) granted by the Competent Authority.

3. Subject to the provisions of article 5 of this Order, no goods specified in the second schedule hereto shall be exported to any country after the coming into force of this Order except under the authority of a licence (hereinafter referred to as an export licence) granted by the Competent Authority.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order but subject to the provisions of the next succeeding article, no goods shall be imported from Albania, Bulgaria, China, Czechoslovakia, Eastern Germany, Hungary, Japan, North Korea, Poland, Roumania or the Union of Socialist Soviet Republics without the authority of an Import licence granted by the Competent Authority.

5. The provisions of articles 2, 3 and 4 shall not apply—

- (a) to baggage, household effects or personal effects as are exempted as passenger's, tourist's or settler's baggage, household effects or personal effects under the provisions of the Customs Ordinance ;
- (b) to *bona fide* trade patterns and samples the f.o.b. value of each consignment of which does not exceed fifty dollars local currency; or
- (c) to goods imported by parcel post by individuals the f.o.b. value of each consignment of which does not exceed one hundred dollars local currency and which are not intended for sale or exchange; or
- (d) to gifts addressed to individuals the f.o.b. value of each consignment of which does not exceed one hundred dollars local currency and which are—
 - (i) *bona fide* unsolicited gifts and not received or exported as merchandise or for sale or for commercial or professional use;
 - (ii) clearly marked as gifts; and
 - (iii) not in excess of twenty-two pounds gross:

Provided that nothing in this article shall be construed as authorising the importation of any coffee, coffee extracts, coffee essences or similar preparations containing coffee without a licence as is required by article 2 of this Order.

6. Application for the issue of import and export licences shall be made in triplicate in the appropriate forms set out in the third schedule hereto.

7. For the purpose of securing compliance with this Order the Competent Authority may enter and inspect any vessel or aircraft or any premises or place whatsoever in which he has reason to believe there may be any goods imported or intended for export contrary to the provisions of this Order.

8. For the purpose of securing compliance with this Order any person carrying on or employed in connection with any trade or business shall produce to the Competent Authority or any person authorised in writing in that behalf by the Competent Authority such books accounts or other documents relating to his trade or business as the Competent Authority may require, and shall furnish to the Competent Authority such estimates, returns or information as the Competent Authority may from time to time require.

9. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising the importation or exportation of any goods the importation or exportation of which is prohibited or restricted by any laws at present in force or which may be enacted hereafter.
