THE DRAINAGE AND IRRIGATION ACT

(Chapter 64:03)

UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE DRAINAGE AND IRRIGATION ACT I
HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

1. This Order may be cited as the Drainage and Irrigation (Prescription of Proportion of Capital Costs) Order 1977.
2. No proprietor of any estate within the area described in the Schedule shall bear any proportion of the Capital Costs of the proposed works to be carried out by the Drainage and Irrigation Board within that area.

SCHEDULE

That area of land situate between the Somerset and Berkshire Canal and Cozier Canal, and bounded as follows :—

- On the North — By the Mean High Water Mark of the Atlantic Ocean commencing at a point at its intersection with the western edge of the Somerset and Berkshire Canal (known as the northern limit of the Tapakuma Drainage and Irrigation Area) and extending in a north westerly direction to its intersection with the western edge of the Cozier Canal.

- On the South** —By the MANIKURU CANAL at a point at its intersection with the Somerset and Berkshire Canal (known as the northern limit of the Tapakuma Drainage and Irrigation Area) and extending in a north westerly direction along the aforesaid MANIKURU CANAL to its intersection with MANIKURU CREEK, thence along its left bank to its intersection with the right bank of the POMEROON RIVER, thence along the right bank of the Pomeroon River with its intersection with the western edge of the Cozier Canal.
- On the East** —By the Somerset and Berkshire Canal (known as the northern limit of the Tapakuma Drainage and Irrigation Area) at its intersection with MANIKURU CANAL, and extending in a north easterly direction to its intersection with a point on the Mean High Water Mark of the Atlantic Ocean.
- On the West** —By the Cozier Canal at its intersection with the right bank of the Pomeroon River and extending along the aforesaid Cozier Canal to its intersection with a point on the Mean High Water Mark of the Atlantic Ocean.
