ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE MINISTERS, MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY AND  
SPECIAL OFFICES (EMOLUMENTS) ORDINANCE, 1965.

(No. 7 of 1965).

UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE MINISTERS, MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF  
ASSEMBLY AND SPECIAL OFFICES (EMOLUMENTS) ORDINANCE,  
1965, THE FOLLOWING ORDER HAS BEEN MADE BY THE MINIS-  
TER OF FINANCE:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Ministers, Members of the House of Assembly and Special Offices (Allowances) Order, 1965, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 14th December, 1964.

2. The travelling and subsistence allowances to be paid in pursuance of subsection (1) of section 4 of the Ministers, Members of the House of Assembly and Special Offices, (Emoluments) Ordinance, 1965, and the conditions subject to which they shall be payable, shall be as set out in the schedule to this Order.

SCHEDULE

Article 2

1. The Premier and every other Minister and the Attorney General if he is not a Minister, shall be paid respectively —

- (a) a commuted travelling allowance of \$120 per month;
- (b) a chauffeur allowance of \$120 per month.

2. The Speaker of the House of Assembly shall be paid —

- (a) a commuted travelling allowance of \$65 per month;
- (b) a chauffeur allowance of \$80 per month.

3. Every Parliamentary Secretary shall be paid a commuted travelling allowance of \$120 per month.

4. Every member of the House of Assembly (other than the Premier, a Minister or a Parliamentary Secretary or the Speaker of the House of Assembly) in respect of his attendance at meetings of the House of Assembly, or of any committee, board, council or authority appointed by the Governor or by a Minister or under powers conferred by any Ordinance and of which he is a member shall be paid —

- (a) travelling allowance at the rate of 28 cents per mile for every mile travelled in a car of over 12 h.p. owned by him and certified by him to that effect;

- (b) travelling allowance at the rate of 19½ cents per mile for every mile travelled in a car of 12 h.p. or under owned by him and certified by him to that effect;
- (c) actual travelling expenses incurred where he is obliged to travel by other means of transport as a result of the area from which he is required to travel to attend meetings aforesaid not being served by transport services operated by the Transport and Harbours Department.

5. The Premier, every other Minister, the Attorney General if he is not a Minister, and every Parliamentary Secretary shall be paid subsistence allowance at the rate of \$4.80 per day for the first fourteen days and \$3.60 per day thereafter, subject to the conditions of payment from time to time applying to officers in the public service.

6. Every member of the House of Assembly in respect of his attendance at meetings of the House of Assembly, or of any committee, board, council or authority appointed by the Governor or by a Minister or under powers conferred by any Ordinance and of which he is a member, shall be paid subsistence allowance at the rate of \$4.80 per day or actual expenses subject to the conditions of payment from time to time applying to officers in the public service.
