**ORDER**

MADE UNDER

THE PUBLIC HOLIDAYS ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 61).

UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE PUBLIC HOLIDAYS ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR AS FOLLOWS:—

WHEREAS it is provided by section 3 of the Public Holidays Ordinance that the birthday of Her Majesty The Queen shall be a public holiday, unless it is ordered by the Governor, by an order published in the Gazette, that Her Majesty's birthday is to be kept on some other day, and then, that other day:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers vested in me as mentioned aforesaid I am pleased to order that the birthday of Her Majesty The Queen shall be kept on Saturday, the 12th June, 1965.
