## ORDER

Made Under

THE DEFENCE (PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES) REGULATIONS (Cap. 15:01)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED ON THE DEFENCE BOARD BY REGULATION 20(2) (h) OF THE DEFENCE (PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES) REGULATIONS, THE FOLLOWING ORDER IS HEREBY MADE BY THE DEFENCE BOARD:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Pensions and Citation. Gratuities (Determination of Reckonable Service) Order 1978, mencement and shall be deemed to have come into operation immediately after the commencement of the Defence (Pensions and Gratuities) Regulations.
- 2.(1) A period of service in an appointment other than a Deterpensionable office or a period of service paid for out of an open mination vote, or of both such services, preceding (whether immediately of reckonor) service as a soldier or as an officer is hereby determined for superanas reckonable service for the purpose of the Defence (Pensions purposes, and Gratuities) Regulations in like manner as such service is taken into account in reckoning the pensionable service of an officer in the public service.
- (2) A period of qualifying service as a teacher in a school to which the Teachers' Pensions Act applies and which would have been reckonable in determining the eligibility of a teacher to have his name entered in the Teachers' Pension Register if he had continued to serve as a teacher is hereby determined as reckonable service for the purposes of the said Regulations if a soldier or an officer had such service as a teacher immediately prior to service as a soldier or as an officer.
