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DECLARATION OF AREAS.

CRAIG DRAINAGE AREA.

The Governor in Council has ordered as follows—

That the area about Craig and Good Success on the East Bank of Demerara bounded on the North by the common boundary between Golden Grove and Good Success from the Demerara River to the western boundary of the East Demerara Water Supply Canal, on the East by the western boundary of

the East Demerara Water Supply Canal from the common boundary between Golden Grove and Good Success to the common boundary between Craig and New Hope, on the South by the common boundary between Craig and New Hope from the western boundary of the East Demerara Water Supply Canal extending westwards to the Demerara River, on the West by the Demerara River from the common boundary between Craig and New Hope to the common boundary between Golden Grove and Good Success shall be a declared area of drainage and shall be called the Craig Drainage Area.

PLAISANCE DRAINAGE AREA.

The Governor in Council has ordered as follows—

That the area about Plaisance Village on the East Coast of Demerara, bounded on the north by the permanent line of sea defences from the common boundary between Sparendaaam and Plaisance and extending thence eastwards to the eastern edge of the high level canal on the boundary between Plaisance and Better Hope, on the east commencing at the eastern extremity of the northern boundary and extending southwards along the eastern edge of the high level dam and thence along the common boundary between Plantations Better Hope and Plaisance to the northern boundary of the East Demerara Water Supply Canal, on the south commencing from the southern extremity of the eastern boundary and extending thence westwards along the northern boundary of the East Demerara Water Supply Canal to the common boundary between Plantations Sparendaaam and Plaisance, on the west commencing at the western extremity of the southern boundary and extending thence northwards along the common boundary between Plaisance and Sparendaaam to the permanent line of Sea defences, shall be a declared area of drainage and shall be called the Plaisance Drainage Area.

BETERVERWAGTING—TRIUMPH DRAINAGE AND IRRIGATION AREA.

The Governor in Council has ordered as follows—

That the area about Triumph and Beterverwagting on the East Coast of Demerara, bounded on the north by the permanent Sea Defences commencing at the common boundary between La Bonne Intention and Beterverwagting and extending eastwards to the eastern edge of the high level dam between Mon Repos and Triumph, on the east commencing at the eastern

extremity of the northern boundary and extending thence southwards along the eastern edge of the high level dam and the eastern side of the eastern sideline trench of Triumph to the northern boundary of the East Demerara Water Supply Canal, on the south commencing at the southern extremity of the eastern boundary aforesaid and extending thence westwards along the northern boundary of the East Demerara Water Supply Canal to the common boundary between Beterverwagting and La Bonne Intention, on the west by the common boundary between Plantations Beterverwagting and La Bonne Intention from the western extremity of the southern boundary aforesaid northwards to the permanent line of Sea Defences, shall be a declared area of drainage and irrigation and shall be called the Beterverwagting-Triumph Drainage and Irrigation Area.

BUXTON-FRIENDSHIP DRAINAGE AND IRRIGATION AREA.

The Governor in Council has ordered as follows—

That the area about Buxton and Friendship on the East Coast of Demerara bounded on the north by the permanent Sea Defences from the common boundary between Plantations La Reconnaissance and Buxton, eastwards to the common boundary between Friendship and Vigilance, on the east by the common boundary between Plantations Friendship and Vigilance from the permanent Sea Defences to the northern boundary of the East Demerara Water Supply Canal, on the south by the northern boundary of the East Demerara Water Supply Canal from the southern extremity of the eastern boundary aforesaid to the common boundary between Buxton and La Reconnaissance, on the west by the common boundary between Buxton and La Reconnaissance from the northern boundary of the East Demerara Water Supply Canal northwards to the permanent Sea Defences, shall be a declared area of drainage and irrigation, and shall be called the Buxton-Friendship Drainage and Irrigation Area.

HELENA COUNTRY DISTRICT DRAINAGE AND IRRIGATION AREA.

The Governor in Council has ordered as follows—

That the area about Helena Country District on the East Coast of Demerara bounded on the north commencing at a point on the west bank of the Mahaica River and the common boundary between Mahaica Village and Hand-en-Veldt and extending thence westwards along the aforesaid common

boundary to the northwestern corner of Hand-en-Veldt, on the east by the West Bank of the Mahaica River from the common boundary between Mahaica Village and Hand-en-Veldt to the common boundary between Vereeniging and Mary's Hope, on the south by the common boundary between Vereeniging and Mary's Hope, from the Mahaica River to the eastern boundary of Clonbrook, on the west by the eastern boundary of Clonbrook from the south-western extremity of Vereeniging to the north-western extremity of Belmont, thence eastwards along the northern boundary of Belmont to the western boundary of Orange Nassau, thence northwards along the western boundary of Orange Nassau to the western extremity of a cross trench across Orange Nassau in alignment with the common boundary between Hand-en-Veldt and Good Hope, thence eastwards along the said cross trench to the western boundary of Hand-en-Veldt and thence northwards along the western boundary of Hand-en-Veldt to its junction with Grove, shall be a declared area of drainage and irrigation, and shall be called the Helena Country District Drainage and Irrigation Area.

MAHAICA COUNTRY DISTRICT DRAINAGE AREA.

The Governor in Council ordered as follows—

That the area about the Mahaica Country District on the East Coast of Demerara bounded on the north commencing at the junction of the public road and the common boundary between Plantation Spring Hall and Tranquility Hall and extending thence eastwards along the common boundary between Plantation Spring Hall and Tranquility Hall to the left bank of the Mahaica River, thence along the left bank of the Mahaica River to the common boundary between Plantation Voorzigtigheid and Hand-en-Veldt; on the south by the common boundary between Plantation Voorzigtigheid and Plantation Hand-en-Veldt from the left bank Mahaica River to a point approximately 262 roods west of the public road; on the west commencing at a point approximately 262 roods west of the public road thence northwards along the dam across Plantation Voorzigtigheid to the common boundary between Plantation Voorzigtigheid and Plantation Cambridge and Good Intent, thence eastward along the common boundary of Plantation Cambridge and Good Intent to a cross dam, approximately 24 roods west of the public road, thence northwards along the said dam to the northern edge of the trench north of the public road, thence westwards along the northern edge of the trench north of the public road, to the eastern edge of the trench east

of the public road thence northwards along the eastern edge of the trench east of the public road to the northern boundary aforesaid described, shall be a declared area of drainage and shall be called the Mahaica Country District Drainage Area.

LOTS NOS. 1 TO 25, EAST COAST, BERBICE, DRAINAGE AND IRRIGATION AREA.

The Governor in Council has ordered as follows—

That the area about Lots Nos. 1 to 25, on the East Coast of Berbice, bounded on the north by the Atlantic Ocean from the common boundary between Ordinance Fort Lands and Lot No. 1 to the eastern boundary of Lot No. 25 on the east commencing at the Atlantic Ocean and extending southwards along the eastern boundary of Lot No. 25 to its southern extremity, thence in the same direction across the Grand Canal to the southern boundary of the said Grand Canal, on the south by the southern boundary of the Grand Canal from the southern extremity of the eastern boundary aforesaid to the Eastern Bank of the Berbice River, thence northwards along the Eastern Bank of the Berbice River, to a point approximately 1,000 feet, thence eastwards in a line running parallel with the Grand Canal to the common boundary between Ordinance Fort Lands and Lot No. 1, thence along the said common boundary between Ordinance Fort Lands and Lot No. 1 to the Atlantic Ocean, shall be a declared area of drainage and irrigation and shall be called the Lots Nos. 1 to 25, East Coast, Berbice, Drainage and Irrigation Area.

LANCASTER TO MANCHESTER DRAINAGE AND IRRIGATION AREA.

The Governor in Council has ordered as follows—

That the area about Lancaster to Manchester on the East Coast of Berbice bounded on the north by the Atlantic Ocean from the common boundary between Lancaster and Whim to the common boundary between Manchester and Ulverston, on the east by the common boundary between Manchester and Ulverston from the Atlantic Ocean to the back boundary of the second depth of Manchester, on the south by the back boundary of the second depths of Manchester, Liverpool and Lancaster from the common boundary between Manchester and Ulverston to the common boundary between Lancaster and Whim, on the west by the common boundary between Lancaster and Whim from the back boundary of the second depth of Lancaster

to the Atlantic Ocean shall be a declared area of drainage and irrigation and shall be called the Lancaster to Manchester Drainage and Irrigation Area.

ULVERSTON TO SALTON DRAINAGE AND IRRIGATION AREA.

The Governor in Council has ordered as follows—

That the area about Ulverston to Salton on the East Coast of Berbice bounded on the north by the Atlantic Ocean from the common boundary between Manchester and Ulverston to the common boundary between Salton and Hogstye, on the east by the common boundary between Salton and Hogstye from its junction with the Atlantic Ocean to its junction with the eastern extremity of the back boundary of the second depth of Salton, on the south by the common back boundary of the second depths of Salton, Alness and Ulverston from the southern extremity of the common boundary between Salton and Hogstye to the common boundary between Ulverston and Manchester, on the west from the back boundary of the second depths of Ulverston, extending northwards along the common boundary between Ulverston and Manchester to its junction with the Atlantic Ocean shall be a declared area of drainage and irrigation and shall be called the Ulverston to Salton Drainage and Irrigation Area.

LIMLAIR TO KILDONAN DRAINAGE AND IRRIGATION AREA.

The Governor in Council has ordered as follows—

That the area about Limlair to Kildonan on the Corentyne Coast of Berbice, bounded on the north by the Atlantic Ocean from the western boundary of Limlair to the eastern boundary of the Ketting between Kildonan and Bush Lot No. 27, on the east by the eastern boundary of the Ketting between Kildonan and Bush Lot No. 27 from the Atlantic Ocean to the projection eastwards of the back boundary of the second depth of Kildonan, on the south by the back boundary of the second depth of Limlair to Kildonan from the southern extremity of the eastern boundary aforesaid to the western boundary of Limlair, on the west by the western boundary of Limlair from the back boundary of the second depth of Limlair to the Atlantic Ocean, shall be a declared area of Drainage and Irrigation and shall be called the Limlair to Kildonan Drainage and Irrigation Area.

JOHANNA CECELIA TO ANNANDALE DRAINAGE
AND IRRIGATION AREA.

The Governor in Council has ordered as follows—

That the area about Johanna Cecelia to Annandale on the Essequibo Coast bounded

On the north by the common boundary between Annandale and Zorg-en-Vlygt from the back boundary of Annandale to the Atlantic Ocean,

On the east by the Atlantic Ocean from the common boundary between Annandale and Zorg-en-Vlygt to the common boundary between Johanna Cecelia and Maria's Lodge,

On the south by the common boundary between Johanna Cecelia and Maria's Lodge from the Atlantic Ocean to the back boundary of Johanna Cecelia,

On the west by the back boundaries of Plantations Johanna Cecelia, Zorg, Golden Fleece, Perseverance, Wastelands, Bremen, Cullen, Abram Zuil and Annandale from the common boundary between Maria's Lodge and Johanna Cecelia to the common boundary between Zorg-en-Vlygt and Annandale, together with the conservancy area formed by the Unu and Himmaribia creeks and the unnamed tributary of the latter creek which is situated to the south of the said creek,

shall be a declared area of drainage and irrigation and shall be called the Johanna Cecelia to Annandale Drainage and Irrigation Area.

ZORG-EN-VLYGT TO ABERDEEN DRAINAGE
AND IRRIGATION AREA.

The Governor in Council has ordered as follows—

That the area about Zorg-en-Vlygt to Aberdeen on the Essequibo Coast bounded

On the north by the common boundary between Three Friends and Aberdeen from a point approximately 13,800 feet west of the Public Road to the Atlantic Ocean,

On the east by the Atlantic Ocean from the common boundary between Three Friends and Aberdeen to the common boundary between Zorg-en-Vlygt and Annandale,

On the south by the common boundary between Zorg-en-Vlygt and Aberdeen from the Atlantic Ocean to the back boundary of Zorg-en-Vlygt,

On the west commencing at the western extremity of the southern boundary aforesaid and extending along the back

boundaries of Plantations Zorg-en-Vlygt, Hoff-Van-Aurich, L'Union, Dageraad, Mocha, Westfield and Alliance to the common boundary between Alliance and Westfield, thence in a straight line to a point on the sand reef forming the south-western corner of Crown land held under Grant No. 2578, thence along the said sand reef lying approximately in a direction N. 14° 15' W. (True) to the common boundary of Three Friends and Aberdeen, together with the Capoey and Calabash Lakes, shall be a declared area of drainage and irrigation and shall be called the Zorg-en-Vlygt to Aberdeen Drainage and Irrigation Area.

THREE FRIENDS TO WALTON HALL DRAINAGE AND IRRIGATION AREA.

The Governor in Council has ordered as follows—

That the area about Three Friends to Walton Hall on the Essequibo Coast bounded

On the north commencing at the northern extremity of the western boundary of Crown land held under Licence of Occupancy No. A787 and extending eastwards along the northern boundary of the said Licence of Occupancy No. A787 to the common boundary between Paradise and Walton Hall and thence along the said common boundary between Paradise and Walton Hall to the Atlantic Ocean,

On the east by the Atlantic Ocean from the common boundary between Paradise and Walton Hall to the common boundary between Three Friends and Aberdeen,

On the south by the common boundary between Three Friends and Aberdeen from the Atlantic Ocean to the sand reef at a distance of approximately 13,800 feet from the Public Road,

On the west commencing at the western extremity of the southern boundary aforesaid and extending along the sand reef lying approximately in a direction N. 19° W. (True) to the junction of the said sand reef and the western extremity of the southern boundary of Crown land held under Licence of Occupancy No. A1309, thence eastwards along the said southern boundary of Crown land held under Licence of Occupancy No. A1309 to its eastern boundary, thence along the said eastern boundary of Crown land held under Licence of Occupancy No. A1309 to the western extremity of the northern boundary aforesaid, together with the Tapacooma

and Reliance Lakes and all the waterpaths between those lakes and the sand reef which forms part of the aforesaid western boundary, shall be a declared area of drainage and irrigation and shall be called the Three Friends to Walton Hall Drainage and Irrigation Area.

VREED-EN-HOOP TO LA JALOUSIE DRAINAGE
AND IRRIGATION AREA.

The Governor in Council has ordered as follows—

The area of the Vreed-en-Hoop to La Jalousie Drainage and Irrigation Area shall be as follows: The area about Vreed-en-Hoop to La Jalousie on the West Coast of Demerara bounded on the north by the line of Sea Defences commencing at the common boundary between Blankenburg and La Jalousie to the eastern river dam of Best; on the east commencing at the eastern extremity of the northern boundary aforesaid and extending southwards along the eastern river dam of Best, to the north edge of the Best south side-line drainage trench, thence along the said edge in a south-easterly direction to a point where it meets the southern boundary of the railway, thence eastwards along the southern boundary of the railway to Vreed-en-Hoop Stelling, thence in a southerly direction across the Public Road to the south edge of the Public Road thence westwards along the parapet of the Public Road to the east river dam of Vreed-en-Hoop, then along the river dam in a southerly direction to the southern abutment of the drainage sluice at Vreed-en-Hoop; on the south commencing at the southern extremity of the eastern boundary aforesaid, then westwards along the south edge of the trench leading to the drainage sluice at Vreed-en-Hoop continuing in the same line across the Public Road to the western edge of the drainage trench on the western side of the Public Road, thence northwards along the said western edge to the southern edge of the south sideline of the north section of Vreed-en-Hoop, thence westwards along the aforesaid south edge of the south sideline of the north section of Vreed-en-Hoop to the western edge of the main drainage trench from the Best, thence northwards along the said edge continuing in the same line across the Public Road to the northern edge of the northern public road trench, thence westwards along the north edge of the north Public Road trench to where the north sideline of north section of Vreed-en-Hoop meets the Public Road, thence westwards along the south edge of the north sideline of north section of Vreed-en-Hoop to the eastern boundary of Windsor Forest, thence

southward along the eastern boundary of Windsor Forest to the northern boundary of the Boerasirie Canal, thence westwards along the said northern boundary of the Boerasirie Canal to the common boundary between Blankenburg and La Jalousie; on the west by the common boundary of Blankenburg and La Jalousie from the northern boundary of the Boerasirie Canal to the line of Sea Defences.

NORTHERN KLIEN POWDEROYEN DRAINAGE AREA.

ORDER IN COUNCIL

made under section 18 (1) on the 24th April, 1953.

1. This order may be cited as the Northern Klien Pouderoyen Drainage Order.
2. The area described in the schedule to this order is hereby declared to be a drainage area and shall be known as the Northern Klien Pouderoyen Drainage Area.

SCHEDULE.

That area of the northern portion of Pln. Klien Pouderoyen on the West Bank of the Demerara River commencing on the West Bank of the Demerara River at the eastern extremity of the common boundary between Northern Klien Pouderoyen and Pln. Vreed-en-Hoop, and its boundaries extending thence southward along the West Bank of the Demerara River to a line 82 feet from and parallel to the common boundary between Northern Klien Pouderoyen and Pln. Vreed-en-Hoop, thence westwards along the aforesaid line to its intersection with the eastern edge of the trench west of and adjacent to the Public Road, thence in a southerly direction along the eastern edge of the trench aforesaid to its intersection with the prolongation eastward of a line 14 feet north of and parallel to the existing barbed wire fence, the aforesaid line being 50 feet north of and parallel to the northern boundary of the section known as Lot C as shown on plan by S.S.M. Insanally dated 6th February, 1930, on record in the Department of Lands and Mines, thence westward along the prolongation of and the latter line aforesaid 50 feet north of and parallel to the northern boundary of the section known as Lot C, to its intersection with the prolongation northward of the eastern boundary of Lot 1 in the section known as Killarney, as shown on plan by D. O. Leila dated 21st March, 1947, on record in the Department of Lands and Mines, thence southward along the prolongation of and the eastern boundary of Lot 1 Killarney aforesaid to the common boundary between Northern and Southern Klien Pouderoyen, thence westwards along the aforesaid boundary between Northern and Southern Klien Pouderoyen to the common boundary on the west between Northern Klien Pouderoyen and Pln. Windsor Forest, thence northward along the aforesaid common boundary between Northern Klien Pouderoyen and Pln. Windsor Forest to the common boundary on the north between Northern Klien Pouderoyen and Pln. Windsor Forest thence eastwards along the aforesaid common boundary between Northern Klien Pouderoyen and Pln. Windsor Forest and the common boundary between Northern Klien Pouderoyen and Pln. Vreed-en-Hoop to the point of commencement.
