**ORDER  
OF THE  
MINISTER OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT  
& REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT**

**Issued under the Local Democratic Organs Act**

{Act No 12 of 1980}

By virtue of the authority vested in the Minister of Local Government at Section 10 {1} of the Local Democratic Organs Act 1980, it is the Order of the Minister of Local Government & Regional Development, that the previous Order issued by the then Minister of Mobilisation on June 11, 1983, be hereby amended.

In exercise of his authority, the then Minister of Mobilisation delegated his powers under the Local Democratic Organs Act 1980, to each of the Regional Democratic Councils established for Regions 1 to 7 {inclusive} and 10, in relation to the local authorities within the Region, for which such Regional Democratic Council is established.

In a Schedule attached to the Order, the then Minister of Mobilisation set out the various areas affected by his delegation of authority. Those areas are identified as:

1. The Local Government Act, chapter 28:02.
2. Districts By-Laws, chapter 28:02.
3. The Municipal & District Councils Act, chapter 28:01.

Now therefore, by virtue of the authority vested in the Minister of Local Government & Regional Development, in the said Local Democratic Organs Act 1980, it is the Order of the Minister of Local Government & Regional Development, that the powers delegated to the Regional Democratic Councils as stipulated above and pertaining to the Municipal & District Councils Act chapter 28:01, be revoked with effect from June 1, 2004.

Section 117 {1};

Section 155;


Section 156 {1};


Section 160, in so far as it relates to town councils and district councils;
