

ORDINANCE No. 29 OF 1920.

AN ORDINANCE to prescribe the fares, tolls, etc., to be levied on the Georgetown Tramways. A.D. 1920.

[2nd October, 1920.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Court of Policy thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Tramways (Fares) Ordinance, 1920. Short title.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in "The Georgetown Tramways Licence, 1899," granted by the Governor-in-Council to the Demerara Electric Company, Limited, under the provisions of the Tramways Ordinance, 1899, and issued and delivered on the nineteenth day of January, 1900, it shall be lawful for the said Company to demand, levy, receive and take for every passenger travelling and for any freight carried upon any of the cars and carriages of the Tramways authorized by the said Licence and by subsequent approval of the Governor-in-Council under section seventeen of the Tramways Ordinance, 1899, or any part thereof, the maximum tolls, fares, rates or charges mentioned and prescribed in the Schedule to this Ordinance in lieu of the tolls, fares, rates or charges provided for in Schedule "B" of the said Licence. 3. The Tramways Ordinance, 1899, Amendment Ordinance, 1920, is hereby repealed. Repeal of Ord. 3 of 1920.

SCHEDULE.

TOLLS, FARES AND CHARGES.

PASSENGERS—

For one journey from any one place to any other place in the same general direction on any of the lines of the Company such fare not exceeding six cents or five tickets not exceeding twenty-four cents, as the Governor-in-Council may from time to time by notice published in the *Gazette* determine. Provided that no such fare shall, without the consent of the Company, be less than five cents or three tickets for twelve cents.

Every passenger shall be entitled to take with him free of charge, any package or packages; provided that with such package or packages he does not occupy more than one seat and the space beneath the seat.

POLICE OFFICERS, ETC.—

Constables (not exceeding three in any car at one time) and firemen shall be carried free when in uniform.

FREIGHT—

Per cubic foot, or at the option of the Licensees, per half-cwt., a sum not exceeding one half-penny per mile or fractional part of a mile.
