

CHAPTER 243.

PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH.

[No. XXXVI of 1927.]

[29th October, 1927.]

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pilgrim Holiness Church Ordinance.

Interpretation.

2.—(1) In this Ordinance,—

“the denomination” means the Pilgrim Holiness Church Corporation by amendment of its articles of association now so named, and, by virtue of the provisions of Act CCIX of the Public Acts of the State of Michigan in the United States of America (entitled, An Act to revise, amend, and consolidate the laws for the incorporation of ecclesiastical bodies), incorporated under the name of the International Apostolic Holiness Union and Churches.

Schedule.

(2) The schedule hereto comprises lands, tenements, hereditaments and interests set forth in the first column, purchased and acquired by the denomination in the name and by the representation of the persons specified in the second column, in the manner set forth in the third column, of the schedule.

Denomination to be deemed a body corporate.

3. The General Missionary Superintendent for the time being of the General Board of Foreign Missions of the denomination shall be deemed to be in the colony a body corporate and shall be known and described as the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and by that name shall have full power to hold or acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance, transport, or otherwise, any movable or immovable property in the colony, or any estate or interest therein, and may sue and be sued in all courts of justice and before all judges or magistrates of the colony.

4. The denomination, subject to any restraint, reservation, or condition, contained in the document whereunder it has acquired title thereto, shall be entitled to sell, transport, mortgage, lease, and otherwise dispose of and deal with, all property for the time being vested in it, or acquired by it under any of the provisions of this Ordinance, may sue for and recover all property and effects movable and immovable to which it is entitled, and may institute, carry on, and defend all legal proceedings in connection therewith.

Denomination may acquire movable and immovable property.

5. No change of the person holding the office of General Missionary Superintendent shall affect any movable or immovable property, or any estate or interest therein, vested in the denomination, but that property and the estate and interest therein shall continue so to vest in the same way and to the same extent as before.

Change in person holding office of General Missionary Superintendent not to affect property or interest in the colony.

6. The General Missionary Superintendent shall have power as a corporate body to appoint an attorney or attorneys to represent the denomination in the colony for the purposes of this Ordinance for the time and with the powers stated in the power of attorney.

Appointment of attorney.

7. Ralph Goodwich Finch, of Kingswood, Kentucky, United States of America, shall be deemed to be the present General Superintendent.

Present General Missionary Superintendent.

8. When a power of attorney, duly executed in the United States of America by the General Missionary Superintendent has been recorded in the deeds registry in the colony, the person or persons named in the power shall be deemed to be the duly authorised representative or representatives in the colony of the denomination, and shall have the right to exercise in relation to the property and affairs of the denomination all the powers contained in the power of attorney (but none other) as fully and effectually as if those powers were exercised personally by the General Missionary Superintendent as a corporate body.

Authorised representative.

9. In all legal proceedings in the colony against the denomination service of process upon the authorised representative or representatives aforesaid, or on the pastor for the time being appointed by the denomination as head of the mission carried on in the colony, or, in the event of there

being no such representative or pastor, by affixing the process on a conspicuous part on any of the mission churches of the denomination situate in the city of Georgetown, shall be good and sufficient service.

Signature of document by representative to be deemed formal execution where required.

10. All transports, mortgages, cancellation of mortgages, leases, transfers, and other documents necessary to give effect to the several matters, acts and things or any of them, mentioned and specified in section four hereof, requiring to be formally executed by or on behalf of the denomination shall be deemed sufficiently executed if signed by the duly authorised representative or representatives, provided the power of attorney under which he or they purport to act authorises the execution of that document or the performance or doing of that matter, act, or thing.

Saving the rights of his Majesty the King.

11. Nothing in this Ordinance shall prejudice or affect the rights of his Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, or any body politic or corporate, or any other person or persons except as are mentioned in this Ordinance.
