CHAPTER 271

BOY SCOUTS ASSOCIATION

No. XIX of 1920. [2nd October, 1920.]

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Boy Scouts Short title. Association Ordinance
- 2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise Interpretarequires,—
 - "the Association" means the Boy Scouts Association incorporated under the royal charter granted on the fourth day of January nineteen hundred and twelve:
 - "boy scout" means a boy scout recognised as such under the constitution, by-laws, or rules of the Association, and includes all officers of the Association
- 3. No one, not under the by-laws or rules of the Associa-Restriction tion duly authorised and entitled to do so, may so publicly on use of wear, carry, or bear, any uniform, badge, token, or Association. emblem, under those by-laws or rules specifically adopted for use under the authority of the Association, as to convey an impression that he is, under those by-laws or rules, entitled to do so.

4.—(1) No boy scout, not otherwise thereunto lawfully Impersonaentitled and authorised, may lawfully pretend to be, or tion by boy scout. pass himself off as, or arrogate to himself the authority, position, or powers of, or claim to be or to act as,—

- (a) a member of the British Guiana police force, or rural constabulary; or
- (b) an officer exercising police functions in the service of the Georgetown Town Council; or
- (c) an agent or officer of the Government.

(2) No boy scout shall seek or attempt, by virtue of his wearing any uniform, badge, token, or emblem, of the Association, or uniform, badge, token, or emblem purporting or appearing to be that of the Association, to enforce or exercise authority otherwise than in accordance with and as authorised by the by-laws or rules of the Association

False claim to connection with Association. 5. No one may lawfully form, organise, or work, or be concerned in forming, organising, or working in connection with, any corps or body which, without due authority granted under the royal charter of the Association, claims or purports to be one of boy scouts, or otherwise to be connected with the Association, or which holds itself out as, or passes itself off as, one of boy scouts, or as otherwise connected with the Association.

Penalties.

6. Anyone contravening any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence, and on summary conviction thereof shall be liable to imprisonment with or without hard labour for any period not exceeding one month, or to a fine not exceeding forty-eight dollars or to both imprisonment and fine.
