

PROCLAMATION



RICHARD E. LUYT. Governor.

By His Excellency Sir RICHARD EDMONDS LUYT, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, upon whom has been comferred the Distinguished Conduct Medal, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of British Guiana, Vice-Admiral of the same, etc., etc.,

WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of the Roads Ordinance, Chapter 277, it is provided that the Governor may, from time to time by proclamation published in the Gazette, declare that any road not mentioned in the schedule to the said Ordinance shall be maintained, or constructed and maintained, out of moneys provided by the House of Assembly, and thereupon the provisions of the said Ordinance shall apply to such road in the same manner as if it had been mentioned in the said schedule;

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the road specified in the schedule hereto should be maintained out of moneys provided by the House of Assembly:

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the power in me vested by section 4 (1) of the Roads Ordinance, Chapter 277, and of all other powers thereunto enabling me, I do hereby declare that the road specified in the schedule thereto shall be maintained out of moneys provided by the House of Assembly.

SCHEDULE

BLACK BUSH POLDER

The road known as the Intersettlement Road, Black Bush Polder Scheme, from the junction of that road with the New Amsterdam/Crabwood Creek public road at Adventure, via the Lesbeholden, Mibikuri, Johanna and Yakusari Settlements to its junction with the said public road at Good Hope.

Given under my Hand and the Public Seal of the Colony at Government House, British Guiana, this 28th day of January, 1966, and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
