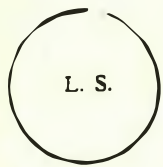

INSTRUMENT APPOINTING A DEPUTY TO THE GOVERNOR.



By His Excellency Sir RICHARD EDMONDS LUYT, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, upon whom has been conferred the Distinguished Conduct Medal, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of British Guiana, Vice-Admiral of the same, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS it is provided by paragraph (1) (a) of Article 19 of the Constitution of British Guiana that whenever the Governor has occasion to be absent from the seat of Government but not from British Guiana, he may, acting in his discretion, by Instrument under the Public Seal, appoint any person in British Guiana to be his deputy during such absence, and in that capacity to perform on his behalf such of the functions of the office of Governor as may be specified in such Instrument:

AND WHEREAS I, Sir RICHARD EDMONDS LUYT Governor, as aforesaid, am about to be absent from the seat of Government but not from British Guiana, on or about the 30th day of December, 1965:

NOW THEREFORE I, the said Sir RICHARD EDMONDS LUYT, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me in that behalf by the said Article 19 of the Constitution of British Guiana do appoint you the said PAUL STAMFORD THIRSK, D.S.C., to be my Deputy within the Colony during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute for and on my behalf during such absence all powers and functions vested in me as Governor for British Guiana, subject, however, to such instructions as I may from time to time address to you for your guidance.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Colony at Government House, British Guiana, this 29th day of December, 1965, and in the Fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
