

## **BRITISH GUIANA**

## INSTRUMENT APPOINTING A MEMBER OF THE JUDICIAL SERVICE COMMISSION



By His Excellency SIR RICHARD EDMONDS LUYT, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, upon whom has been conferred the Distinguished Conduct Medal, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of British Guiana, Vice-Admiral of the same,

etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS it is provided by paragraph (1) of Article 89 of the Constitution of British Guiana that there shall be in and for British Guiana a Judicial Service Commission which shall consist of the Chief Justice, as Chairman, the Chairman of the Public Service Commission, the senior Puisne Judge, and one other member;

AND WHEREAS it is provided by paragraph (2) of Article 89 of the said Constitution that the Governor, acting in his discretion, may appoint to be a member of the Judicial Service Commission a person who is or has been the holder of high judicial office;

AND WHEREAS, it is provided in paragraph (5) of the said Article that the office of the appointed member of the Judicial Service Commission shall become vacant at the expiration of three years from the date of his appointment or such earlier time as may be specified in the instrument by which he was appointed.

AND WHEREAS by instrument under the Public Seal of the 12th day of March, 1963, JOSEPH LYTTLETON WILLS, Esquire, C.B.E., was appointed to be a member of the Judicial Service Commission.

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the said provisions, I do hereby appoint JOSEPH LYTTLETON WILLS, Esquire, C.B.E., to be a member of the Judicial Service Commission with effect from the 12th March, 1966, until the expiration of the 25th day of May, 1966.
