INSTRUMENT APPOINTING THE CHAIRMAN OF THE
POLICE SERVICE COMMISSION

WHEREAS it is provided by paragraph (1) of Article 99 of the Constitution of British Guiana that there shall be in and for British Guiana a Police Service Commission which shall consist of a Chairman, the Commissioner of Police and such number of other members, being not more than three, as the Governor, acting in his discretion, may from time to time decide;

AND WHEREAS it is provided by paragraph (2) of Article 99 of the said Constitution that the members of the Police Service Commission other than the Commissioner of Police shall be appointed by the Governor, acting after consultation with the Prime Minister, by instrument under the Public Seal;

AND WHEREAS it is provided in paragraph (5) of the said Article that the office of a member so appointed shall become vacant at the expiration of five years from the date of his appointment or such earlier time as may be specified in the instrument by which he was appointed:

AND WHEREAS by instrument under the Public Seal of the 31st Day of October, 1964, FREDERICK RAMPRASHAD, ESQUIRE, was appointed to be a member of the Police Service Commission until expiration of the 30th Day of October, 1966.

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the said provisions, and acting after consultation with the Prime Minister, I do hereby appoint FREDERICK RAMPRASHAD, ESQUIRE, to be Chairman of the Police Service Commission from the 1st March, 1966, until the expiration of the 25th day of May, 1966.

and in the fifteenth year of Her Majesty's
Reign.
