

BRITISH GUIANA

INSTRUMENT REVOKING THE APPOINTMENT OF A PARLIAMENTARY SECRETARY



Bv His Excellency SIR RICHARD EDMONDS LUYT, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, upon whom has been conferred the Distinguished Conduct Medal, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of British Guiana. Vice-Admiral of the same, etc., etc.. etc.

RICHARD E. LUYT. Governor.

WHEREAS it is provided by paragraph (1) of Article 40 of the Constitution of British Guiana that the Governor, acting in accordance with the advice of the Prime Minister may by instrument under the Public Seal, appoint Parliamentary Secretaries from among the members of the Legislature to assist Ministers in the discharge of the responsibilities assigned to them in pursuance of article 33 of the said Constitution;

AND WHEREAS it is provided by paragraph (2) of article 40 of the said Constitution that the provisions of articles 30, 32 and 35 thereof shall apply to Parliamentary Secretaries as they apply to Ministers other than the Prime Minister;

AND WHEREAS it is provided by sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (3) of article 30 of the said Constitution that a Minister other than the Prime Minister shall vacate his office if his appointment is revoked by the Governor, acting in accordance with the advice of the Prime Minister, by instrument under the Public Seal;

AND WHEREAS on the 9th day of February, 1965. Roydon Field-Ridley, Esquire, was appointed a Parliamentary Secretary to assist the Minister of Works and Hydraulics pursuant to paragraph (1) of article 40 of the said Constitution;

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the said provisions and acting in accordance with the advice of the Prime Minister. I do hereby revoke the said appointment of Roydon Field-Ridley, Esquire.

Given under my Hand and the Public Seal of the Colony at Government House, British Guiana, this 1st day of February, 1966, and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
