PROCLAMATION

By the President of the Cooperative Republic of Guyana.

STANDARD OF THE PRESIDENT

By virtue and in exercise of all powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby declare on behalf of former President Mrs. Janet Jagan that the proclamation of the 23rd day of February, 1970, relating to the Armorial Ensigns of the Republic and also the Great Seal and Presidential Arms and Standard or Banner thereof is hereby amended by the substitution for paragraph 4 thereof of the following paragraph:

"4. STANDARD OF THE PRESIDENT

An emblem comprising representations of a Harpy Eagle standing over two plantains, two eddoes and two pieces of cassava, flanked by a sheaf of rice on the right and two stalks of sugar cane on the left, on the right of the eagle is a mechanical gear-wheel with twelve teeth which envelopes a factory and its four chimneys, the rising sun is in the background, on the left of the eagle is the Amerindian symbol which represents woman.

And for the background, five horizontal panels, the middle panel red, the first outer panels green, the second outer panels gold, the Harpy Eagle, the plantains, the eddoes, the cassava, the sheaf of rice and stalks of sugar cane central and straddling all five panels, the width of the middle panel in relation to the first outer panel being in the proportion of four to one and in relation to the second outer panels being in proportion of four to three;

And the vertical and horizontal dimensions of the standard being in the proportion of one to two"

The aforesaid proclamation is hereby further amended by the substitution for the painting of the Standard of the President annexed thereto by the painting of the Standard of the President annexed hereto, and this proclamation shall be deemed to have come into operation on 19th December, 1997.
