## CONSTITUTION OF THE ORDERS OF GUYANA

By virtue and in exercise of all powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby proclaim that the Constitution of the Orders of Guyana shall be amended in the manner and to the extent set out hereunder —  $\,$ 

Section	Amendment
Sections 10(2), 15(b', 26(a), (b) and (c)	For "is necessary to give effect to any recommendation made under section 49(2", wherever these words occur, substitute "special circumstances may in his opinion require".
	Substitute the following —
Section 27	"27. Where a person, who holds an award under section 18(1), is given a higher award thereunder, he shall return the insignia and ribbon relating to the lower award to the Chancellor of the Order and shall wear the insignia and ribbon of the higher award and use the suffix of the higher award after his name."

Section	Amendment
Section 44(a)	For "on the recommendation of" substitute "after consultation with".
Section 44(b)	For "Leader of the Opposition" substitute "Minority Leader".
Section 44(d)	For "on the recommendation of" substitute "after consultation with".
Section 47	For "The Secretary to the office of the President" substitute "The Permanent Secretary to the Office of the President or any such person as he may designate for the purpose".
Section 49(1)	(a) For "shall subject to his obtaining the concurrence of the Prime Minister in any case other than a recommendation relating to the person holding the office of Prime Minister," substitute 'may".
	(b) Renumber the subsection as section 49.
Section 49(2)	Delete.
