REGULATIONS

Made Under

THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 132).

UNDER SUBSECTION (5) OF SECTION 63 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Wireless Telegraphy (Amendment) Regulations, 1968, and shall be construed and read as one with the Wireless Telegraphy Regulation*, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any Regulations amending the same.

2. Regulation 9 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion of the words "or to the other appropriate authority" immediately after the word "Council."

3. Paragraph (2) of regulation 29 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following paragraphs substituted therefor —

"Licence not granted to alien.

(2) No licence, other than a Broadcast Receiving Set Licence, shall be granted to an alien and no station for transmitting messages shall be established or used on premises controlled by an alien :

Provided that the Governor-General may grant a licence other than an Amateur Licence to an alien :

And provided further that the Postmaster General may, in such circumstances as he sees fit and with the approval of the Minister charged with responsibility for the Postal Services, grant an Amateur Licence to an alien.

(3) For the purposes of this regulation the expression "alien" has the meaning assigned to it in article 125 of the Constitution of Guyana."
