

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ORDINANCE

(Chapter 142)

UNDER SECTION 9 OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ORDINANCE, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS:—

1. These Regulations, which amend the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, *may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs (Amendment) Regulations, 1970.

2. The Principal Regulations are hereby amended in the following respects—

(a) by the insertion in paragraph (1) of regulation 2, immediately before the definition of the word "preparation", of the following definition—

“midwife” means a person who is a registered midwife for the purposes of the Nurses and Midwives Registration Ordinance;

(b) by the renumbering of regulations 15, 16 and 17 as regulations 16, 17 and 18 respectively; and

(c) by the insertion immediately after regulation 14 of the following regulation—

“Special provisions with respect to midwives.

15. A Midwife is hereby authorised, so far as may be necessary for the practice of her profession, to be in possession of and to administer pethilorfan:

Provided that such midwife shall—

(a) on each occasion on which a supply of such drug or preparation is obtained produce to the supplier thereof—

(i) the personal register of cases kept by her for the inspection of the General Nursing Council;

(ii) a book (hereafter in this regulation referred to as the drugs book) wherein shall be entered the name, quantity and form of the

drug or preparation obtained and the supplier shall aside of such entry affix address, signature, and the date thereof;

- (b) after administering such drug or preparation enter in the drugs book the name, quantity and form thereof together with the name and address of the person to whom it was administered;
- (c) at no time be in possession of a quantity of pethilorfan exceeding the quantity which would be required for the administration of two hundred milligrams to each person whose case of pregnancy is recorded in the personal register of cases and who has not, since the last entry was made in relation to her, ceased to be pregnant; and
- (d) except when the practice of midwifery requires otherwise, keep every drug or preparation in her possession in a locked receptacle, only to be opened by her."
