

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE LABOUR ORDINANCE
(Chapter 103)

UNDER SECTION 35 OF THE LABOUR ORDINANCE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS ARE HEREBY MADE BY THE PRESIDENT:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Hours of Work (Laundries) (Amendment) Regulations, 1971, and shall be construed and read as one with the Hours of Work (Laundries) Regulations, 1962*, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. Regulations 4 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended in the following respects —

(a) by the substitution of a colon for the full stop at the end of the regulation; and

(b) by the addition thereto of the following proviso—

“Provided that the foregoing provisions of this regulation shall not apply to any person who is employed in or about the business of a Laundry situate within the precincts of any hotel or hospital.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These Regulations amend the Hours of Work (Laundries) Regulations 1962, to remove the prohibition on the employment on Sundays and certain other public holidays of persons in laundries attached to hotels and hospitals. Persons so employed will be entitled to be paid remuneration as provided by section 29 of the Factories Ordinance.
