

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE CARRYING OF
LIGHTS BY VEHICLES IN THE NIGHT TIME.

Short title. 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Vehicles (Carrying of Lights) Regulations, 1937.

Lights to be carried by certain vehicles. 2. Every vehicle, other than a motor vehicle, cart, bicycle or tricycle shall, during the night-time carry—

- (a) two lamps each showing to the front a white light visible from a reasonable distance, and fixed on opposite sides of the vehicle ;
- (b) one lamp showing to the rear a red light visible from a reasonable distance and fixed on the centre line of the vehicle :

Provided that, if any such vehicle carry a red reflector fixed on the centre line of the vehicle, in the centre of a circle painted white of not less than one foot in diameter and showing to the rear, it shall be sufficient compliance with the provisions of subsection (b) of this regulation.

3. Every cart shall, during the night-time, carry one lamp showing a white light visible from a reasonable distance and fixed under the centre of the axle. Lights to be carried by carts.

4. Every bicycle or tricycle shall during the night-time carry— Lights to be carried by bicycles.
 (a) a lamp showing to the front a white light visible from a reasonable distance and fixed to that part of the machine known as the head, or to the front fork :

Provided that no such lamp need be carried if the machine is being wheeled by a person on foot as near as possible to the left or near side of the road.

(b) A lamp showing to the rear a red light visible from a reasonable distance :

Provided that if any such vehicle carry a red reflector fixed to the rear mudguard and showing to the rear and that portion of the rear mudguard which is visible from the rear be painted white, it shall be sufficient compliance with the provisions of subsection (b) of this regulation.

5. The regulations made by the Inspector-General of Police on the 1st day of May, 1905, and published in the *Gazette* of the 13th May, 1905, are hereby repealed. Repeal.

6. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st January, 1938. Date of commencement.
