## REGULATIONS

### MADE UNDER

### THE HOLIDAYS WITH PAY ORDINANCE, 1952.

(No. 3 of 1952)

UNDER SECTION 9 OF THE HOLIDAYS WITH PAY ORDINANCE, 1952, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Holidays with Pay (Advisory Committees and Enquiry) (Procedure) Regulations, 1954, and shall be applicable to any enquiry held under section 3A or any Advisory Committee appointed under Section 4 of the Ordinance.

2. In these Regulations —

“the Ordinance” means the Holidays with Pay Ordinance, 1952;

“chairman” means the person appointed as chairman of any Committee appointed under section 4 of the Ordinance;

“Committee” means an Advisory Committee appointed under section 4 of the Ordinance;

“competent person” means a person appointed by the Governor in Council to hold any enquiry under section 3A of the Ordinance.

3(1) Any person may, by notice in writing signed by the Chairman or a competent person, as the case may be, be required —

- (a) to attend any meeting of the Committee or of the competent person and give evidence before the said Committee or the said competent person; or
- (b) to attend any meeting of the Committee or of the competent person and produce any document which, in the opinion of the Committee or of the competent person is relevant to the subject matter of the enquiry; or
- (c) to furnish in such manner as may be specified such particulars as may be required by the Committee or by the competent person.

(2) Any person who wilfully fails to comply with any notice in writing addressed to him under this regulation shall, on summary conviction thereof, be liable to pay a fine not exceeding twenty-four dollars.

4. A committee may continue to act notwithstanding any vacancy which may for any reason occur in its membership.

5. A Committee or a competent person, as the case may be, may call in the aid of one or more assessors, specially qualified in the opinion of the Committee or of the competent person to give assistance to the Committee or to the competent person in the matter under enquiry or in any matter relevant to such enquiry.

6(1) Each report by a Committee or by a competent person shall be in writing, and shall be addressed to the Governor.

(2) Such reports shall be signed by the members of the Committee who concur therein or by the competent person, as the case may be, and shall in the former case be accompanied by any report signed by any dissenting member thereof.

(3) Such report shall be forwarded to the Governor as soon as conveniently possible after the conclusion of the enquiry or, if the Governor has requested an interim report, as soon as conveniently possible after the receipt of such request.

7. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations, any Committee or competent person, as the case may be, may regulate the procedure to be followed at any enquiry in order that a report of such enquiry may be submitted to the Governor expeditiously.
