

BRITISH GUIANA.

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936, (No. 29 of 1936).

UNDER SECTION 36 OF THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Animal Diseases (Foot and Mouth Disease) Regulations 1954.

2. All animals and meats and their meat products whether fresh, frozen, chilled or dried, fittings, utensils, pens, crates and other animal containers, hides, skins, horns, hair, wool, dehydrated or fresh blood, bones and bonemeal, tankage, hoofs, fodder, straw for forage or packing, milk and other dairy products, and manure and other animal waste shall not be brought from any part of the area described in the Schedule hereto into any other area of the Colony.

3. The discharge of sweepings, garbage or other waste material from vessels or aircraft arriving from any part of the area described in the schedule hereto into any other area of the Colony is hereby prohibited.

4. The Director may require the disinfection of footwear or the feet, if footwear is not worn, of all persons entering any other area of the Colony from any part of the area described in the schedule hereto.

5. All passengers and goods arriving at the airport at Atkinson Field shall be discharged at a Boarding station designated by the Comptroller of Customs.

6. Any Government Veterinary Officer or any person appointed by the Director may stop any person or vehicle or may board any aircraft, ship or other vessel arriving in any other area of the Colony from any part of the area described in the schedule hereto, for the purpose of carrying out such examination as he considers necessary and he may seize or disinfect such articles as he deems necessary.

7. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars.

SCHEDULE

That area bounded as follows —

On the north and west by the boundary between the Colony and Venezuela;

On the east by parallel of longitude 60° W as far north as the 8th parallel of latitude West, thence in an easterly direction on the 8th parallel of latitude West as far as the Waini River thence down the Waini River to its mouth;

On the south, by the boundary between the Colony and Brazil.
