## REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

## THE FACTORIES ORDINANCE

(Chapter 115)

UNDER SECTION 26 OF THE FACTORIES ORDINANCE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Hours of Work (Saw Mill Workers) Regulations, 1956.
2. In these Regulations —  
 “saw mill worker” means any person employed to perform manual labour in connection with the operation of a saw mill;  
 “saw mill” means any place where wood is prepared by mechanical process for building purposes.
3. The number of hours which may normally be worked by a saw mill worker in any week shall not exceed forty-four.
4. It shall be the duty of an employer to keep posted up in a conspicuous place on the premises of the saw mill one or more copies of these Regulations.
5. Any person who commits a breach of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, upon summary conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty dollars.
6. The Hours of Work (Berbice Saw Mill Workers) Regulations, 1953\*, are hereby revoked.
