THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE

(Chapter 132).

UNDER SECTION 97 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE
THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE
POSTMASTER GENERAL WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE
GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the British Postal Order (Amendment) Regulations, 1957, and shall be construed and read with the British Postal Order Regulations*.

2. Regulation 3 of the British Postal Order Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution for the figures "16", "28", "42", "54", "66", "78", "1 02" and "1 26" in the second column thereof (which specifies the selling price of British Postal Orders of face values set out in the first column) of the figures "18", "30", "44", "56", "68", "80", "1 04" and "1 28" respectively.

3. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st October 1957.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport).

These Regulations increase by 2 cents from the 1st October 1957, the price of British Postal Orders for amounts up to 5 shillings.
