

BRITISH GUIANA.

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE PLANT PROTECTION ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 245).

UNNDER SECTION 16 OF THE PLANT PROTECTION ORDINANCE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS ARE HEREBY MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Plant Protection (Citrus Planting Materials) Regulations, 1961.

2. In these Regulations —

“citrus planting materials” means the seed of any citrus fruit or the whole or any part of a growing or dying plant of the genus citrus.

3. Except as otherwise provided by these Regulations no citrus planting material shall be imported into the Colony.

4. Nothing contained in these Regulations shall prohibit —

(a) the importation of citrus planting materials by the Department of Agriculture; or

(b) the importation of any fruit of the genus citrus.
